Loder was unfortunate in missing his century, Russell beating him with a ball that kept low. Loder batted solidly, hitting 12 fours. Berry gave a sparkling display, which included seven fours. Buckle was uncertain at the start, but when set batted attractively. Nineteen fours were included in his total, which took 95 minutes to compile. Russell and Thatcher bore the brunt of the attack, bowling 17 and 18 overs respectively. Thatcher brought off a good catch in dismissing Chin: the ball was driven hard and low, Thatcher taking it with his left hand. (The Sun, Sunday 4 October)
