BLUES SQUAD CONFIRMED FOR 2023-24









A veteran Test player, a global T20 star, a pair of Premier Cricket stalwarts and a prodigious teenage all-rounder headline the new talent in a 25-player NSW Blues squad for the 2023/24 summer. The squad, that will be under the tutelage of newly appointed master coach Greg Shipperd, is made up of 20-full contract players and five players on a rookie contract.

A further eight NSW players - Sean Abbott, Pat Cummins, Josh Hazlewood, **Nathan Lyon**, Steve Smith, Mitchell Starc, David Warner and Adam Zampa - earned Cricket Australia contracts for 2023/24 and form part of the broader Blues group.



Leading the list of newcomers to the Blues' list is seamer Jackson Bird. The 36-year-old returns to the state he grew up in after more than a decade in Tasmania and will be looking to continue his rise up the list of all time Sheffield Shield wicket-takers from his current position of ten with 350 scalps.

Bird is joined as a new addition to the list by Sydney Thunder star **Chris Green**, who made his First-Class debut last summer as an uncontracted player and went on to become NSW's Sheffield Shield Player of the Year.

Blake Macdonald (St George CC), who forced his way into the Blues line up for the final Shield game of the season with irresistible 2nd XI form, has earned his first contract.

Ross Pawson has also earned his first NSW deal after several strong seasons at Premier and 2nd XI level. in 2022-23 Pawson took 60 wickets at 15.97 for Northern District.

Last summer's Australian under 19 captain, Manly Warringah's Joel Davies, has earned a two-year rookie contract, joining four rookies that were already contracted – Jack Nisbet, Will Salzmann, Lachlan Shaw and Hunar Verma.

CNSW Chief of Cricket Performance Greg Mail said the changes to the squad recognised established and sustained success, consistent performance in Premier and Second XI cricket and rising talent.

"With the additions of Jackson (Bird) and Chris (Green) we get some experience from guys with well documented credentials." Mail said.

"Both Blake (Macdonald) and Ross (Pawson) have deserved their contracts through sheer weight of runs and wickets at Premier Cricket and Second XI level. Their contracts show that when players consistently perform at that level, we will look at those performances positively.

NDCC has enjoyed a fantastic working relationship with the Coaches Association for almost 14 years. President and Founder of HKHDCCA, Bruce Wood, has done an incredible job in developing the association into what it is today. Thousands of local juniors have benefitted from the coaching clinics, accreditation courses and overseas trips that are on offer. Long

may it last! Below outlines what a busy year it has been.

The Coaches' Association (HKHDCCA) held its 14th Annual General Meeting on 24 May 2023.

Bruce Wood outlined the highlights of the 2022-23 cricket season, which included receiving a total of 489 registrations to attend the 7 school holiday junior cricket clinics (average 70 boys and girls per clinic). The Coaches' Association was pleased to be able to hire the new MTO Indoor Centre at reduced rates, providing a wonderful additional facility for the boys and girls aged between 5 and 14, ranging from beginners to representative standard players. The Coach / Players ratio across all the school holiday clinics in 2022-23 was an impressive 1 / 6.35.

The Coaches' Association co-ordinated the 25th annual HK&HDCA U/15 Ross Turner Cup match and the 20th anniversary U/13 Glenn Hourigan Cup fixture, which took place on 12 February 2023 at Turramurra. Sadly, Glenn Hourigan (HK&HDCA Life Member) passed away on 3 May 2023, aged 79. The RTC teams were very well coached by **Nick Hook and Ryan Swain** from NDCC.

The Coaches' Association / Northern District CC U/15 team enjoyed its tour to India from 7 – 23 April 2023, playing 9 matches in Bangalore, Pondicherry, Chennai and Goa. The 28-person touring party had an amazing experience, both on and off the cricket field. The 14 players were led by **Josh Miller** (Head Coach), Dan Friedrich (Coach) and Bruce Wood (Manager). 

NSW Youth Championship: 14-year-old Aanya Siingh shines

New South Wales [Australia], May 6 (ANI): Young Indian-Australian all-rounder Aanya Siingh is already creating history in the world of cricket with her impressive performances on the pitch. At just 14 years old, Aanya has already achieved an impressive list of achievements and awards, making her a popular rising star in the cricketing world.

Aanya's recent performances have been particularly noteworthy, with standout performances including scoring 100 not out of 67 balls in the NSW Youth championship against Hornsby District and 127 not out of 157 balls in the NSW Premier cricket against Campbelltown. She also clinched 5 wickets for 7 runs in 3 overs against Normanhurst Warrawee in a club match.

In addition to her club performances, Aanya has made a name for herself in state-level cricket. She has been selected for the NSW U15 Metro Academy for the past two years and was recently picked for the NSW U16 Metro State Squad for the 2023-2024 season.

Aanya also captained the Northern District Premier Club U18 girl's Squad and was named in the Top-4 leading run-scorers and wicket-takers across NSW Premier Cricket for the U18 Brewers team. She was also named as the Inner West district Harbor Girls Representative team captain for the 2023-24 season.

Her impressive performances have not gone unnoticed, with Aanya receiving several awards and applause. She was named the Women Player of the Year for the Brewers in the 2022-23 season and was also awarded the Emerging Young Player of the Year for the Northern Districts Women Premium grade.

Additionally, she has also received Best Batter Awards for both the Inner West Harbour in NSW Youth Championship and Castle Hill Cricket Club, as well as the Best All-rounder Award for Castle Hill Cricket Club in the 2020-21 season. Off the field, Aanya is also committed to improving her skills and sharing her knowledge by coaching junior teams. She recently completed her accreditation for the New South Wales Level 1 Coach for Junior Cricket and has worked as an assistant coach for holiday clinics for junior cricketers. She has also been appointed as an assistant coach at MYC Cricket Academy in Pendle Hill. Aanya's dedication and hard work have already led to many accomplishments in her young career, and she is undoubtedly a talent to watch out for in the world of cricket. (ANI)
